


## Between Champagne and Crystal

Distance:20 km Validity: Year-round From 66€\* per person – transport not included \*Price based on a group of 25 people, subject to change



The day begins with **a guided tour of Clairvaux Abbey**, founded in the 12th century by Saint Bernard. This impressive site tells the story of eight





To finish on a high note, take **a guided tour of a Champagne cellar, followed by a tasting.** And to extend the experience at home: a complimentary bottle for each participant.

## Apples, cheese, and bubbles

Distance:48.4 km Validity: Year-round

From 66€\* per person – transport not included \*Price based on a group of 30 people, subject to change

- Arrive at **the cider museum for a guided tour** punctuated by a tasting of the farm's products. A video presentation immerses you in **the secrets of production**, before a ride on a miniature train through the heart of **the orchards of the Pays d'Othe**.
- Next stop: Chaource for a generous, local lunch served at a restaurant (drinks included!). In the afternoon, two options: a visit to a cheese factory to discover the famous creamy Chaource, still molded by hand as in the old days, or a visit to a mushroom farm, followed by a gourmet tasting.
- Finally, we head to Les Riceys, the only village in Champagne to boast 3 AOCs (Champagne, Coteaux Champenois and Rosé des Riceys). Guided tour of a cellar and tasting of the famous Rosé des Riceys, a wine of character, the favorite of Louis XIV!

## From the cellar to the workshop

Distance:45.1 km Validity: Year-round From 121€\* per person – transport not included \*Price based on a group of 25 people, subject to change

A day entirely dedicated to the champagnes of the Aube region — yes! On the program: three cellar visits, including one Cistercian cellar, a champagne lunch in a cellar, and of course... a complimentary bottle to extend the pleasure at home.

In the afternoon, head to Essoyes, the village of the painter Pierre-Auguste Renoir. There you will discover the Espace des Renoir, the family home, the garden, and the painter's studio. An immersion into the artist's world, punctuated by a tasting... of the Renoir family champagnes, naturally.

## **Gourmet Getaway**

Duration: 2 days / I night Distance: 115.4 km Validity: Year-round

We begin with a leisurely stroll through the city of Troyes, where its half-timbered houses, cobbled streets, and churches with remarkable stained-glass windows tell the story of a rich medieval past.

Next, head to Cellier Saint-Pierre to taste the famous Prunelle de Troyes, whose recipe they keep secret. For lunch, treat yourself to the quintessential dish of Aube gastronomy: the authentic Troyes andouillette sausage (and for those less adventurous, we promise there are other options).

In the afternoon, it's time for **Champagne** with a cellar tour followed by **a tasting of three** iconic cuvées. Back in Troyes, enjoy some free time exploring the covered market: Troyes and Chaource cheeses, Champagnes, and the delicious pastries and chocolates of Pascal Caffet, a Meilleur Ouvrier de France (Best Craftsman of France)!

For those interested in the medieval period, step inside the **Taverne des Compagnons de la** Table Ronde (Round Table Tavern) and sample beverages of yesteryear—mead, ale, or spiced wines.

Dinner in the city centre and overnight stay in a 3-star hotel.

Discover the cider museum, complete with a tasting and a ride on a miniature train through the orchards of the Pays d'Othe. Then, a change of scenery: head to Chaource for a lunch featuring local flavours (drinks included!).

In the afternoon, you'll inevitably visit a traditional cheese dairy where Chaource cheese is hand-ladled into molds, following time-honored methods.

The day concludes in **Les Riceys**, the only village in Champagne with **three appellations** (Champagne, Coteaux Champenois, and Rosé des Riceys), for a tour of a winery and a tasting of Rosé des Riceys, Louis XIV's favourite wine.
